


Celebrations of Gratitude and Thanksgiving!

It's a Breeze! A big thanks to Karen Reddick for all her hard work getting Breeze up and running. Several of you have already transitioned over to this new system, thank you! For those of you who still need to do so, or if you are new to online giving and want some assistance, Karen or Diana Ehri

can help you. Just let us know.

If you missed the treasurer's update on October 1st there are a few features we want to highlight. First, you still have the ability to give one-time or set up recurring gifts from your credit or debit card. And, you can now also give through direct deposits from your checking or savings account with ACH transfers. Utilizing the ACH transfer will result in lower transaction fees. We do pay a small transaction fee to process online payments, and Unity covers this because we feel this is well worth the convenience. With our new system, if you choose to, Breeze gives you the option of covering that fee instead by checking a little box if you want your entire contribution to go to the church. Breeze

also gives you the opportunity to split your gift over multiple funds if there are specific places you'd like your donation to be allocated like for flowers, the choir, and children's program - to name a few.

Now for the blah, blah, blah Our income for the month of September was \$28,387.39. Expenses totaled \$16,891.08 with an ending balance of \$11,496.31. Our checking/savings account balance as of September 30, 2023, is \$15,245.88. The interest earned from matured CDs from the sale of the church is \$16,441.15. Our year-to-date ending balance is negative \$4,220.67. Don't be alarmed by this though, our expenses vary widely from month to month because of the inconsistent flow of expenses and the CDs keep accumulating interest.

We greatly appreciate you and your heart felt generosity as you continue to support Unity of Olympia and our mission.



"Every Brilliant Thing"

Words from the Prayer Team

"Gratitude unlocks the fullness of life. It turns what we have into enough, and more. It turns denials into acceptance, chaos into order, confusion into clarity. Gratitude makes sense of our past, brings peace for today, and creates a vision for tomorrow." Melody Beattie



Now that is a powerful statement. Gratitude is the final step in our five step Unity prayer practice, the wrap up affirmation. Yet sometimes the words of gratitude arise as just words and without the feeling that "It is so."

November is the time we focus on gratitude which is one of the most powerful forces on earth. If we truly live in the world of gratitude, everything that arises is for good. When we are able to be grateful for both the hard circumstances and the glorious parts of our journey, we gain strength, love, energy. We are able to keep our hearts open to the flow of good in our lives.

Yet, sometimes our gratitude practices get stale.

A few weeks ago, I was fortunate to see a play entitled "Every Brilliant Thing" by Duncan Macmillan. It reminded me of the power of living in a space of gratitude. The protagonist rose from a traumatic childhood with a mentally ill parent into living a successful thriving life. She did so by creating a list of 1,000,000 brilliant things about life, beginning as a child and continuing into adulthood.

Many of us have used the practice of a gratitude journal, but this woman had a few twists that made it even more powerful:

- 1. There could be no repeated items.
- 2. Each brilliant thing needed to be written with specific attributes, so instead of "sleeping in", it might be "sleeping in on a Monday morning while burying my head under the blankets".
- 3. Instead of keeping her list in a journal, she put them on post it notes all over the house, in books, on the back of her shopping list, or in a letter to a friend...so that she might happen upon them at unexpected times to bring delight again.
- 4. Some days she wrote a hundred to lift her out of her funk, some days she wrote one.

So, I invite you to spice up your Thanksgiving by giving this a try. Notice the wild and crazy things that we take for granted these days...pink hair on a 70-year-old lady, candle light that changes color, people walking around a park talking to someone thousands of miles away, or the luscious drip of a s'mores ice cream cone. Our world is an amazing place, if we cultivate the eyes to see.

As Unity's third principle states, "Thoughts have creative power to determine events and attract experiences." Wouldn't we all love more love, peace, joy, and pumpkin pie? Of course, and we can make it so.

For the month of October we contributed to an overall, project-wide collection that resulted in a whopping 9,583 lbs of food donated plus \$3,575 in cash donations, resulting in a grand total value of \$21,016! That's worth 11,547 meals! Together we make a difference.
