Dear Friends.

In Unity we begin and end everything with prayer. I think of prayer as a practice that brings me closer to the truth of who I am in Spirit. As such, I feel freed through this practice. It is my greatest hope that each of you, my dear friends, have the same experience. Now, when I talk about prayer, let me qualify that by saying that the way I understand prayer, it includes meditation and contemplation.

For me, I love the words of prayer. Last month I referred to one of the beatitudes that encourages those who "hunger and thirst for righteousness." I hunger and thirst for words that bring my soul to life. I savor them when I find them, looking at each word and phrase to find it's deeper meaning in my life. 

Our New Online Giving Program

In August, we announced we're switching our online giving provider. Our mission is to better steward every gift contributed to our church, and that's why we're going to use Breeze, powered by Tithe.ly, as our new online and text-giving platform.

We truly appreciate that many of you took advantage of the Wild Apricot program, either through one-time or recurring gifts, and we're excited to transition over to Breeze for future online and text giving donations.



A lot of thought went into switching giving providers, and ultimately, because of all the benefits that come with using Breeze, we decided it was the right move for us. We were searching for a more comprehensive church management system that would better serve our needs, and Breeze came up #1 and checked the boxes we were looking for. Breeze is all-inclusive and has online and text giving built right in for no additional fees. So it will save us money while giving us better service. Plus, it helps us consolidate tools and manage all gifts in one secure system making daily admin tasks much easier (such as running year-end giving statements for our members). As you can see, we are pretty excited about it.

We will keep you posted as we get closer to going live. Busy working in the background, transitions can be bumpy, etc.

Now for the blah, blah, blah Our income for the month of July was \$15,187.46.Expenses totaled \$15,946.03 with a negative ending balance of \$758.57.Checking/savings account balance as of July 31, 2023, is \$9,492.73. Don't be alarmed though, our expenses vary widely from month to month because of the inconsistent flow of expenses. As always, we greatly appreciate your continuous support through the automatic giving program.



Prayer Team

A transformational Tale of Angels and Prayer Boxes

You may not believe in angels, but bear with me. I am trusting that since you are a Unity truth student, you believe in the power of prayer.



This is the fourth principle of Unity. Now not all prayers are answered with visions. It may come in the form of a nudge to go in a different direction, a dream that grabs hold and won't let go, a synchronistic event, or a profound sense of release and peace. But in my story, an angel and prayer box, go hand in hand.

Over twenty-five years ago, I felt ousted by my church community. Of course, it wasn't everybody, and it is certainly not our present community. You could think of it as a hostile takeover by a group that wasn't very attached to our community, coupled with a flaw in the bylaws. A small group of individuals didn't approve of how I was appointed to the board, so they did a recall that sent me packing. I was hurt and defensive. I left the church community and nearly lost my faith for almost two years. Then an amazing thing happened.

During my absence, I became very conscious of thought patterns that were getting in the way of what I wanted in my life. I began letting go of my ego leading me into roles and situations that were not for my highest good. I learned to set personal boundaries, to say no a little more. I spent a lot of time studying Unity principles and practices, and the power of prayer became evident.

Unity's fourth principle states, "Through prayer and meditation we align our heart-mind with God. Denials and affirmations are tools we use." I cannot say I believed it immediately. Sometimes I am a slow learner or perhaps a devoted questioner. How did it work? What is the best way to pray? How do we find the Divine in horrific circumstances?

Prayer became the focus of my spiritual practice: breathing, releasing ego and emotions, affirmations, meditating in the stillness, realizing oneness with God, gratitude. Prayer in all circumstances, both joys and sorrows. As my dear friend said to me, "God is in the journey and God is in the destination." Though my practice was consistent and deepening, I still struggled with doubt.

Then came my turning point.

My sister and I went to a Unity women's weekend retreat, a place and time for some deep exploration and contemplation. In the corner of our meeting room there was an altar. Placing my prayer request into the box, I asked for wisdom on how to reclaim my faith and spiritual community. I left it there, not certain I was asking the right question or even anticipating a clear answer.

A year went by...

The next spring, I returned to another Unity women's retreat. Same place, same box. As we were getting set up, I headed to the prayer box to add my new request. When I opened the lid, a little piece of paper was stuck along one side of the box...It looked familiar. I pulled it out and realized it was the same request I had placed in the box a year earlier. Huh?! Did God even hear, or in this case, see my prayer? In hindsight it was clear, of course a divine intention was set into action.

I walked away puzzled and lay down on my yoga mat with the rest of the group to do a deep meditation. I drifted slowly into the Silence. Soon I became aware of what appeared to be a small angel figure, much like a figurine, standing at my shoulder. I was a little surprised. I was definitely in that liminal space of imagination and prayer, so I figured it was my imagination. Still, as I paid attention, the angel grew bigger until this being was standing beside me, nearly human sized, radiant. A very clear voice or Presence said, "It is time to go back and heal Unity of Olympia."

That is not a message I could ignore, received 25 years ago. I am still present in this blessed community.

I am so grateful for the opportunity to grow my faith in prayer. No, not all prayers are answered with a vision. It has been a rare event in my life. Usually, it is more of a push, or a dream, or something I read that says something profound. And it isn't always the answer I want. Yet with absolute confidence I know prayer is answered. Through this experience, prayer became the cornerstone of my spiritual practice and my purpose in life. I studied most of Myrtle and Charles Fillmore's books, other Unity writers, like Rev. Linda Martella-Whitsett. Becoming part of the prayer team, holding the sacredness of people's prayers, learning to be a spiritual director to help others find their path to the Divine within, all of these continue to lead me deeper into an experience of the Sacred Mystery.

Prayers are answered in the right time and the right form for our highest good. God is good, all the time.

"When I pray, I feel my heart go deeper into my God."
